Exhibits will be selected for type, uniformity, quality and maturity. Exhibitors must raise all exhibits. No exhibitor shall be allowed more than one entry for each premium. All exhibits must be true to entry as to variety and classification or otherwise the superintendent and judge may change them. Such grain and grass seeds as do not mature during the current year prior to holding of the fair, the seeds maturing the prior year may be shown. Paper plates will be furnished for vegetables and fruit. 4-Her's are welcome to exhibit.
